January Priorities.

COVID-19: The government have announced that we are in Tier 4. Our main focus for January is to keep our communities safe and respond to COVID-19 breach reports. Keep yourself updated with the latest guidelines on the gov.uk website.

Anti-Social Behaviour: We will be patrolling the 'ASB hotspot's across the NL56 beat, engage with perpetrators and action when necessary.

Partnership Working Relating to Parking Issues: We are aware of the ongoing issue with parking surrounding Bradgate Park. We are working together with different agencies to tackle this issue.

Crime Update and Crime Prevention Advice.

Across the beat there has been a decrease in burglaries, thefts and vehicle crime. What has come to our attention is the recent social media reports revolving around thefts of dogs. We have had no reports made to us regarding thefts of dogs across Charnwood in the last 3 months. The Derbyshire Rural Crime Team have released the following advice:

"We have seen an increase in thefts of dogs over the past week or so. Pups are being targeted also. Most of the dogs that have been stolen are working breeds, like Collies and all Spaniel breeds. Please make sure your dogs are secure and all microchipped ASAP. Keep kennels secure at all time. Keep an eye on your dog's when walking them off leads."
