Crime/anti-social behaviour update.

Crime:

In October we found a decrease in reported thefts and vehicle crime across the villages. The most reported crime was Criminal Damage, this has mainly been damage caused to vehicles and damage caused to buildings (both public and private). Unfortunately, we have no suspects identified but the beat team are continuing to patrol the villages. We recommend residents to look into installing CCTV, alarm systems and security lighting in and around their property.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB):

In October we had 7 reports of Anti-Social Behaviour across the villages. This has mostly been reports of youths behaving anti-socially in and around Stafford Orchard Park, Quorn and on Mountsorrel Lane, Rothley. The beat team are patrolling these "hot spot" areas in the hopes to tackle this issue and identify perpetrators.

The beat team are also aware of the ongoing graffiti issue across the villages, especially in Quorn and going into Loughborough. The beat teams across Charnwood are working together with Charnwood Borough Council to help tackle this issue. We recommend residents to report any new appearances of graffiti to Charnwood Borough Council.

What have the beat team been up to?

Throughout October the beat team have been carrying out various community engagements.

Many great questions were asked by the students. On 28th October PCSO's Katrina and Shaheen visited Lime Tree Nursery to educate the children on the role of the police and people they can trust.

PC Greg and PCSO Mitch have held a speed op in Newtown Linford in response to the concerns raised about speeding vehicles in the village.
