Crime/anti-social behaviour update.

Crime:

In September we found a slight increase in thefts, vehicle crime and burglaries across the villages. The most reported crime being vehicle crime, these have mostly been opportunists that have taken belongings from vehicles. We are asking residents to be vigilant and to ensure your homes and vehicles are kept secure. We advise residents to remove all belongings from their vehicles, including small change.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB):

In September we received 3 reports of Anti-Social Behaviour, these have been reports of persons driving anti-socially and/or revving their engines.

We are aware of an increase of vehicles driving anti-socially through the villages from Barrow-upon-Soar, onto the A6 and into Quorn and onto Fenny Copse Lane/Netherhall Drive. The beat team have been doing some pro-active patrols and action has been taken with various drivers.

The beat team is regularly patrolling the 'hot spot' areas to prevent/detect anti-social behaviour (ASB).
